All the holes at the King's Course at Gleneagles, have evocative and pithy Scots names. For example, the 5th, "Het Girdle" (Hot Pan), is a challenging par 3 with trouble every-where except on the green, while the 17th's name, Warslin' Lea (Wrestling Ground), reflects the difficulty so many golfers experience with this long and sweeping par 4.
