The supreme heathland course
1900

Much of Sunningdale's air of open invincence comes from the fact that the player of the tee must play his second shot, with tricky hazards to raise the greens and well-placed bunkers to catch anything that rolls. The course starts off in unusual fashion with a very long hole just short of 500 yards. The boundary is to the right. Out the fairway is comfortably wide. However, playing to the left and too much safety can leave an awkward chip up the banked side of the plateau green and, with bunkers set into it, there is little room for error. With half the greens placed on hills, Sunningdale rewards good chipping and pitching.
