1887

Soft-sprung rolling fairways and yawning duneside bunkers make Royal St. George's a classic links course. A good score on the outward half-can lay the foundations for a winning total, but this can be so easily spoiled by the long par 4- 13th, the daunting 14th alongside the boundary wall, and the heavily bunkered 15th. No matter what his score, the golfer can take pleasure from the beauty and seclusion of verdant fairways that run along hollows between high dunes, making golf at Royal St. George's a very private pastime.
