Surrounded by the sea on three sides, Portmarnock offers a genuine links course comparable with any of the great British championship links; indeed, Cobby Locke rated it among the finest in Europe. It never lacks challenge, and many of the less demanding holes become severe tests of skill and control when the wind comes in off the sea. Two in particular—the 14th and 16th—can wreck a card.
