"Difficult but fair test of golf"

The exceptional championship course at Old Warson, is a true expression of a Robert Trent Jones design. Host to the 1971 Ryder Cup matches, Old Warson earned its reputation as a difficult but fair test of golf. If there is any advantage, it would go to the right-to-left player, but even an educated draw into the rolling fairways will rarely permit a level stance at address for the next shot. This is a shot maker's course and driving accuracy and a controlled iron game are of much greater value than the necessary length to reach such par 4's as 5-8-11-15 and 18.
