#7 "Duel"

San Francisco Golf Club had an artist create the course in the name of A.W. Tillinghast, *"Golf's forgotten genius"*. Prevailing westerly winds hurt the player on 1-3-6-13-16-18. The Tillinghast influence around the greens are the wonderful bunker settings, making it most important for the player to have a solid short game. #6 is perhaps the best hole with an into the wind drive and with length at 430 yards, reaching home in two is not an easy task. Then #7 follows, a one shot hole at 189 yards, down hill to a green that slopes away from the player, making it difficult to hold and to putt on. "Tillie", as A.W. was affectionately called, compiled a great course with over 100 bunkers and the pear-shaped greens make scoring a real accomplishment.
