Piping Rock features contrasting nines. The front nine rolls over relatively level terrain, with the old polo fields usually in view. The back side plays over more rugged territory, making use of more of MacDonald's steep bunkers. Typical of a Macdonald design, a number of holes are based on famous precedents. The par 4 8th is a rendition of the "ROAD HOLE" at St. Andrews. The green is set on an angle to the approach and a circling pot bunker sits affront the green-waiting! The par 4 12th is Prestwick's "ALPS" hole, as the fairway is in a valley with bunkers on both sides and the approach to the green is blind over a ridge. The 14th "FIELD" at 450 yards is the strongest hole on the course and it is played from an elevated tee offering two choices, a long carry over a pair of cross bunkers, or a shot to the left avoiding the impending. Then the player must right himself and hitto a tilted green. Good luck!

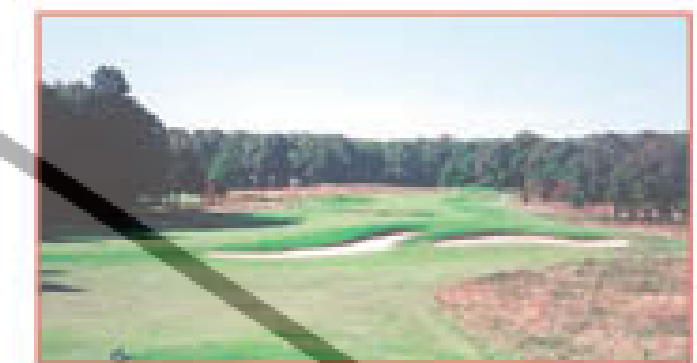
