"Idyllic"

One of the outstanding attributes of the course is its routing with the opening nine running counter-clockwise around the perimeter of the property and the closing nine running loosely in a clockwise direction within the loop created by the first nine. Such a routing only matters if the site is windy, which is the case of Fairfield. Like Muirfield in Scotland, the holes play wildly different depending on the wind. In the case of Fairfield, the wind is generally off the Sound which means it blows left to right across the 2nd hole "Long". #4 - 134 yards is one of the scarier "Short" holes in the MacDonald/Raynor portfolio of great name holes, and with the green against a pond and the wind blowing in, a '5' is a distinct possibility. The course continues on its way with name hole after name hole offering distinctive shots at each stop. If Fairfield sounds like an idyllic spot for a game, it is! Unlike so many parkland courses which wear a golfer down, Country Club of Fairfield invigorates the player to get back out to its challenges
