Already drenched in tradition as the first-ever country club, Brookline became even more famous with tantalizing finishes in the two US Opens held there, won by Francis Ouimet in 1913 and Julius Boros half a century later. Narrow, tree-lined fairways and exceptionally small greens make accuracy off the tees and fine chipping essential for a low score.
