



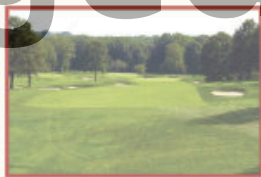

No course typifies the Ross style better than Plainfield. The rise and fall of the terrain and the relative absence of trees make the course resemble the heathland of Scotland, and is quite similar to Gleneagles. Ross's philosophy that golf holes should be designed to fit into natural settings, with boldly-contoured greens atop plateaus which then promotes the truism that a "Ross course" be a severe examination in inventive chipping is never more evident than on many of the holes on Plainfield truly epitomizing "the Legacy of Dornoch"
