

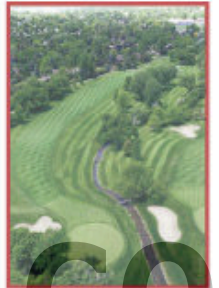

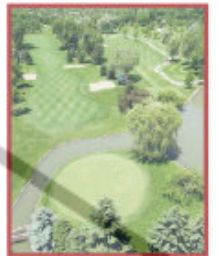

In its rarefied atmosphere, the 6955 yards of Cherry Hills plays shorter than it shows on the card. Designed by William Flynn in 1922, it was here, 38 years later, that Arnie won his only U.S. Open. Ben Hogan named the 470 yard 14th one of the most difficult par 4's in America. Its fairway rises from the tee with trees and out of bounds on the right; on the left, thick rough falls away to a creek. The hole then swings sharply to the left offering a narrow opening to the green set between a deep bunker on the right and the ever-threatening creek that curls a round and behind the left edge. The 14th starts a demanding finish that includes a 194 yard par 3 to a very small green encircled by sand and trees. Then comes the short par 4 16th that demands supreme accuracy: an exacting 529 yard par 5 17th to an island green; and finally the 489 yard 18th often described as one of golf's finest last holes.
