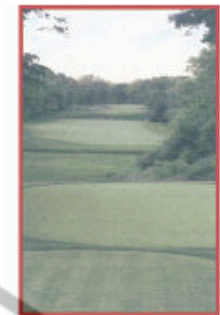

The #4 course, now the North, was originally designed by Willie Park, Jr. The North is now 7157 yards, par 70 routed over a widely varied piece of Midwestern topography. Several of the holes roll over old farmland, but the strongest holes loop around several ridges that also feature a serpentine creek that comes into play. This venue has hosted, the Western Open, PGA, NCAA, U S Open, and the Senior Open, with its most recent event being the 2003 US Open won by Jim Furyk, and since 1915, the course remains true to Willie Park's vision with testing bunkers and treacherous greens.
