Southern Hills is fundamentally a driver's course and thus the key to it is the tee shot. While an accurate drive is a necessity for any course with championship pretensions, it is absolutely crucial at Southern Hills. Nobody ever won anything there who did not drive the ball with extreme accuracy and plenty of length. The reason is that Southern Hills, while not particularly long at 7093 yards par 70, it plays every inch of that measurement and more. Most of the holes are flat-the club's name is misleading, for there is no help from nature, such as a downhill roll, in driving. Most notably the drive at 18 is complicated by water on both sides of the fairway and therefore has to be precisely positioned to open the way uphill to the last green. This is a strong finish to a course with rough like steel wool and sand like talcum powder.
