Legendary golf architect Donald Ross displayed his creative genius when he designed CC of Buffalo, positioned on the Onondaga escarpment, running around and through a limestone quarry. Six of the holes- 5,6,7,11,12 and 13 - incorporate the unique beauty of the limestone. Holes 13,17, and 18 are on the lower level below the escarpment. This provides CC of Buffalo with two signature holes - the sixth, a par 3 located in the midst of an old quarry that in years past provided stone for much of buffalo, and the 18th, which sits below the massive natural rock garden..CC of Buffalo hosted the 1912 US Open won by Johnny McDermott shooting 294 and winning his 2nd consecutive Open and also Horace Rawlins who won the 1st US Open in 1895, played in the 1912..his last!
