



The Golf Club was not built as a recreational country club but as a Men's golf club. Hence, "hit till you're happy" is the theme-- enjoy the round. Pete Dye's elegant design is described as "Old English" emulating perhaps Sunningdale and Wentworth with its parkland like setting. The course is on relatively flat land and has wide fairways. Perhaps the initial highlight is #3 - 185 yards par 3 where Dye instituted his renowned use of Rail ties.. and perhaps like today's text message fad, they are everywhere. The next most unusual part of the course is the bridge over Blacklick Creek at #6 470 par 4 where the cover is an old Rail Box Car. The routing has many turns, but the stretch of holes from 12 through 16 are the most brilliant. The 369 yard par 4 13th is a world-class hole that doglegs to the left off the tee. Dye made extensive use of sawed off telephone poles in the bunker right of the green. As with many great short par fours, it is a classic risk-reward where the further to the left one hits the tee shot the more you will be rewarded but..Careful! The par 5 14th is a big hole in all respects at 618 and 15 is a beautifully bunkered 449 yard par 4 with a tilted green facing the 2nd shot. 16 is a challenging 200 yard par 3 that plays over a gorge to a relatively small putting surface. Next to the green in a 275 yard old tree hangs the *Hangman's Noose* - just in case after finishing poorly on the 16th, the golfer wants to ..well you know!
