Scioto is an original 1916 Donald Ross design. Although there have been modifications to the course on the greens and bunkering over the decades, the original Ross routing is still intact. It has small greens which are crowned for the most part. The elevated greens are so well bunkered, that the correct shot in is that of a high soft trajectory. Scioto represents the archetypal tree-lined American style target course. The par five 8th is held in high esteem in that it has a creek that meanders through the rolling hills and it provides an effective hazard on many holes, most notably the eighth. This hole doglegs thru the terrain that plays over water to a Ross type elevated green. Although the course has little or no similarities to a links course, the stone walls that ring some of the holes on the back nine resemble those at Muirfield and North Berwick.
