Situated in the far north western part of Massachusetts , Taconic is part of Williams College. It was built on what, in the past, was cattle grazing farmland, and before that, woodlands. Williamstown was, in prehistoric times, a lake bed carved by glaciers, creating a nearly impervious layer of clay upon which was deposited a thick layer of loam. This natural state contributes to Taconic’s lush conditions. The course itself offers every shot in the book with undulations, turns, and spectacular par 3’s, most notably #9 and #17. The routing was completed in 1928 by Stiles and & Van Kleeck, a Boston firm. Originally it was a par 73. Today, at 6808 yards par 71, Taconic continues to be considered as one of the best college courses anywhere and its saying “medio tutissimus Ibis”
